

ARCH Findings on the HER

The results from ARCH classes continue to be uploaded to the Historic Environment Record. The most recent additions are the results from the Gairloch and Auldearn Community Timeline courses, with Strathdearn and Invergarry to follow soon. These include a number of new sites (prehistoric and modern) and some insights and documents relating to already known sites e.g. plans for the icehouse at Invergarry House. Boblainy Forest Archaeology Project

ARCH worked with Kiltarlity Community
Council's Boblainy Forest Archaeology project
during 2010 and 2011, providing something for
all interests: background heritage courses,
opportunities to research local heritage, oral
history reminiscence, a programme of guest
speakers focussing on heritage in the forest and
uses of forestry in the community, and a survey
of a deserted settlement in the wood. Members
of the group produced an impressive display of
their results. This was launched in June and
was on display again during Highland
Archaeology Festival.









Kyle Line Display

The results from the first 3 Heritage Along the Kyle Line courses have been brought together at the Friends of the Kyle Line Museum at Kyle Station, where they now form a permanent display (see below). The final Kyle line course will take place in the New Year, when participants will create a leaflet and MP3 commentaries.

Pathways into the Past

Taking ancient route ways as a theme, these sessions offer an introduction to landscape archaeology for all those who want to research and record their local archaeology. The section of the route to be explored will focus on Milton and Kildary and this part of the course will focus on researching information for a community display.

Surveying Your Heritage

Learn practical survey techniques which will enable you to record archaeological features in your area. There will be two introductory sessions (27th Oct and 3rd Nov 6.30 – 9.00pm) at the Mercat Centre, Milton, then a practical outdoors session over the weekend of 5th Nov, 10am-4pm near Milton. This will be followed by a third session indoors at the Mercat Centre (10th Nov, 6:30-9pm) to look at the results. Booking essential.

Delve into the Past: Post-Excavation

These sessions will look at the results from our summer excavation, going into more detail on what happens next in the excavation process.
