# Display the Past: Behind the Scenes at the Museum

## **Black Isle Heritage Memories**

Our transcriber, Anne, is working avidly to complete the written transcriptions of the information recorded at the 'Remembering your Community' Sessions held in Avoch, Culbokie and Tore earlier this year. We have collected new and additional information for 167 Black Isle sites and features! All this will be compiled into a report to be circulated to all the participating communities, local libraries and the Highland Council's Historic Environment Record. Anne is also transcribing the audio interviews conducted throughout the project, in preparation for submission to the Am Baile archive. Cait and some of the project participants will be visiting local schools this April and each of the communities are looking at how they can continue the project.

# Pathways into the Past

Learn how to conduct an archaeological deskbased assessment in preparation for outdoor surveying and recording. Taking the fragmentary remains of ancient routeways as a theme, these sessions offer an introduction to landscape archaeology skills for all those who want to research and record their local archaeology.

# The Mound, near Golspie Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> April, 1-2pm

Come and marvel at the engineering vision of Thomas Telford - and explore the less well known terminus of the Dornoch Light Railway. (P) Meet at the car park (NH 7749 9819).

### Red Smiddy, Poolewe Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> April, 1:30-2:30pm

Discover this well preserved 17<sup>th</sup> century iron works and enjoy a walk along the river. (P) Meet at the car park on the east side of River Ewe, below the bridge in Poolewe on the A832 (NG 8581 8080).

Explore the Findon Mills and associated features, including the remains of the Findon Dun.

### Fodderty–Dochmoluag Tower Sunday, 2<sup>nd</sup> May, 2-4pm

Step into the past on this walking tour from Fodderty Cemetery along an historic route to the 17<sup>th</sup> Century Tower House at Dochmoluag. (P) Meet at the car park of Fodderty Cemetery on the A834 (NH 5119 5936).

# Aviemore Cairn

Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> May, 1-2pm

Visit an easily accessible early Bronze Age Clava type cairn.

Meet at the cairn (NH 8970 1347), which is on Muirton Road, signposted from Grampian Road.

## Allangrange Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> May, 2-4pm

Come and discover the remains of the medieval chapel of St. John and nearby buildings. (P) Meet at Grewars potato store, Taeblair Farm (NH 6315 5136).
